



#### Local Issues Update



#### We need your help for BeachWatch '97

Portsmouth FoE will to holding it's social beach survey of 1997 on Batarday 20th September: If you are able to spare a couple of hours to help please be on the beach outside Easthey Pool at 11am Contact Paul on 01705.

During our last survey 1012 items were collected which weighted in at 83Kg. Of the litter collected over 55% was plastic which a particularly of concern because most plastics do not degrade and will be in the environment for years to come. An estimated one milion seabirds and 100,000 manne mammals die every year from enfanglement in, or regestion of, plastics.

11% of the litter was woody materials which was mainly drift wood. 12% consisted of paper heris and 10% were items of metal. Only 1 sanitary item was found which was an improvement on past surprise.

The most dangerous items found during the survey were two LIVE sholpun cartridges.

The results from the surveys are used in the national Beachwardt survey. Beachwardt is a practical conservation initiative, organised by the Marine Conservation Society with sponsorship from



Readers Digest. The Beachwelch campaign were launched in 1993 to raise awareness of the issues of marine debris, monitor litter on blactnes and encourage action to reduce marine poliution at course.

In the 1996 Beachwalch 203 UK beaches covering 1986m were surveyed in detail. In total 291,228 items of debris were recorded, weighing an estimated 17.51dbg (17 tonnes).

The News recently reported that Portemouth City Council is avoiding handing out penalty nutices for littering on the beach as they believe that this might upset tourists. The Council are using extra cleaning teams instead to keep the beach clean.

Local authorities are direledy having to apend £12-15 million annually to lasep popular UK beaches clear of lifter dropped by careless tourists or washed up from the sea. Why should we have to go on paying for the liponant feet that have no nespect for the environment. Allowing people to get away with littering and then during up effect them will only perpetuate the situation.

Hampshire Incinerator Climbdown And Re-Consultation.

Hampshire are reconsidering part of its incineration plans after Communities Against Toxics (CATS) threatened to challenge Hampshire County Council in the High Count over the increased size of the South West Harfs

incinerator. Hampshire have agreed not to implement this part of the contract (passed in February) pending further consultations.

Hampshire FoE had argued that...

- the size of the incinerator had been increased without consultation
- that the contract now allowed for unspecified amounts of commercial waste.
- the pricing and structure of the proposals were being driven by NFFO (Non-Fossil Fuel Obligation) subsidies which were obtained with Council
